## FROM THE INTERIM PASTOR

Dear Friends,

This year the season of Lent begins on Wednesday February 22 and culminates on Easter Sunday April 8<sup>th</sup>. During these forty days, (not counting Sundays) we once again have the opportunity for new beginnings. Lent present us with time specially marked on the calendar to look again at Jesus as he was led by the Spirit for 40 days in the wilderness. In that barren landscape he had time to think through direction for his life,

sort things out, and to wrestle with the options before him before he began his public ministry.

Traditionally in the Christian church, Lent is a season of spiritual renewal that helps us to prepare for the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter. It is a time for prayer, self reflection, self examination, repentance, and renewal. It is a good time to pause and take stock: am I becoming the kind of person want to be? Or am I letting things slide, giving way to what is easy, comfortable? Do I stand for something I can be proud of? Lent is a good time

to stand up and be counted. What can we each be counted on for? What can we do to help our church stand for something? Where do we find meaning? Ultimately Lent gives us hope, hope for meaning in our lives and for turning towards the source of Love. We all face the ups and downs of life and as Christians we can move through times of discouragement and fulfillment by keeping our eyes on the One who went through all we have to go through and more, who died and rose again. May we be on this journey together, intentionally spending time in prayer, reflection, and openness to the movement of Gods Spirit of love. In faith,

## GOVERNING TASK FORCE (GTF) UPDATE

At the annual meeting, members of the GTF gave an update on their progress. The following is a summary of the presentation:

There has been a lot of curiosity about the work GTF is doing, so I want to give a brief report about our progress. Members of the task force have been meeting regularly throughout the holiday period. We have plans to bring forward our recommendations, but do not want to interfere with meetings Nancy is sponsoring over the next few weeks. We have developed a timeline for engaging the congregation and ultimately asking for their approval to launch a trial year.

Soon members of our committee will begin meeting with the individual Boards. In addition, we will be communicating through articles in the Spirelite. We are also planning to sponsor meetings in the Houghton Room at coffee hour. Working with Nancy, we have selected Sunday, April 29<sup>th</sup> for an "all church meeting" to allow us to introduce our recommendations to the Congregation.

We hope to get a draft of the proposed bylaw changes to the Bylaw Committee by early April. Assuming we stay on this timeline, we will be calling a Church vote to enter into a trial period sometime in early June. The intent would be to change the structure at that point on a "trial basis", using the new structure throughout the balance of the church fiscal year, and then call another vote at the annual meeting in January 2013 to formally adopt the new structure.

So what should members of the congregation be doing during this time?

Stay informed by attending informational meetings and reading communications from the GTF. Continue to support the existing structure and ministries, and volunteer your time and talents. We would encourage members of the congregation to support some changes in the way we volunteer our time and talent. We are moving towards a structure that has less people in appointed "Board positions" and more people doing the actual work within the areas of ministry. This model will allow multiple points of entry for volunteers to commit their time and talents, taking on ministries that vary in length and level of commitment.

Plan to attend our luncheon on Sunday, April 29<sup>th</sup>, immediately following church service.
